1988: a very prestigious year for PGNS.....


CANADA WINS WORLD CUP

The 15th Color Slide Biennial was held in Australia on August 13, 1988. This is an international competition among 32 countries. Each country is limited to 20 entries in this year's Pictorial competition. This year Canada won the competition beating France for the title by 3 points.
