Happy New Year Everyone.

The upload deadline for PGNS's CAPA Spring Round (Artistic, Open Colour, Digital Theme-Music and Canada: My Country) is **January 7, 2024**.

Please remember that CAPA will not accept images which have any decorative elements like frames, borders, pin-lines, or mats in your image. This includes the edges and markings of scanned film.

CAPA defines **"Artistic"** as an image that is produced with the intention to portray a creative vision primarily based on an aesthetic and emotional thrust. Your image must fit one of these three subthemes:

- 1) Abstract Art (ie double exposure, smoke, ICM)
- Altered Reality (using photographed elements to create a fictional scene to tell a message or story). Note: HDR images without any additional changes are not considered Altered Reality.
- 3) Creative Image (made using props or elements not normally viewed by the human eye like bokeh, long exposures, high speed captures)

The **CAPA digital theme "Music"** has OPEN editing. As always, all portions of the image must have been taken by the maker. CAPA will be looking for images which fit the following 4 subthemes.

- i) Creative musical image can be abstract, expressionist or altered reality. Image can include: musical notes, lines (staff), musical instrument(s), musician(s), person(s), etc
- ii) Musical instruments image of musical instrument(s).
- iii) Musical performers musician(s) which includes: orchestra, band, singers, choir, marching band, etc.
- iv) Performing to music includes: all forms of dancing and/or movement to music such as: street dancing, dance performance, ballet, exercise class, musical production, etc.

In the **Open Colour** competition, infra-red or Monochrome images will not be accepted. Your image must fit one of the following themes:

1) Landscape – images can include natural landscape, urban landscape and seascapes. Hand of man is permitted.

- Man-made Structures/Objects
 images of any man-made object, buildings, transportation (air, land, sea or space), still life, rural and city landscapes. Images may contain the hand of man.
- 3) Nature/Wildlife image(s) of subjects such as amphibians, flowers, insects, marine-life, reptiles, wild or domesticated animals or birds, etc. This category also includes botanical, insect, subjects. Domesticated animals and birds are permitted in this theme. Hand-of-man elements contained within the image is also permitted.
- 4) Person(s) image(s) can be traditional or casual portraits and could incorporate the environment and/or workspaces of the individual(s).

For **Canada: My Country**, images must have been shot within Canada. This competition has open editing, and sky replacement is allowed provided that the maker has captured the sky.

Photography Trivia

The first photos of movement



The settling of a debate—whether, during its gait, all four of a horse's hooves are simultaneously off the ground—first spurred English photographer Eadweard Muybridge in 1872 to look for a way to capture the sequence of movement. It took six years, but in 1878, Muybridge succeeded. He arranged 12 trip-wire cameras along a racetrack in the path of a galloping horse. The resulting photo sequence proved that there is a point when no hooves touch the ground and set the stage for the first motion pictures.
