CAPA has recently changed its subject criteria for the Atlantic Zone Competition. Images must have been shot within Atlantic Canada to be eligible. As such, the Executive has made the decision not to enter the images previously selected to go away in the Club entry for the Atlantic Zone. Scores from the competition selection in the Fall will still be applied for the PoY points. However, what this means is that individuals in the club that hold an individual membership with CAPA can use that image as part of their entry (maximum of 2 images) in the Atlantic Zone Individual competition, should it meet the subject criteria. You will be contacted shortly about your image.

Don't forget that the Digital Salon is now open for entries. There are 5 sections (Open Colour, Open Monochrome, Nature, Fine Art as well as Amateur Novice that you can submit up to 6 entries per section and earn recognition and medals in the International Association of Art Photographers (IAAP). The top awards of the salon will be presented at the CAPA Photography Conference this summer at Kelowna's UBC Okanagan Campus. The conference is being hosted on the West Coast from June 23-June 30. Photography Trivia

Engineers at the <u>SLAC National Accelerator Laboratory</u> have spent the last seven years building the <u>Legacy Survey of Space and Time</u>, or LSST, camera. The camera is the size of a small car and weighs about three tons, and at five feet across, the lens holds a <u>Guinness World Record</u>.

The 3,200 megapixel camera, powerful enough to spot a golf ball 15 miles away, will be the heart of a new telescope at the Vera C. Rubin Observatory in the mountains of Chile, where it'll spend a decade mapping the entire southern sky. Scientists predict the LSST camera will help them discover 17 billion new stars, as well as 6 million new objects in our on solar system.
