Hello PGNS Members

It's time to start thinking about your CAPA interclub entries for the Spring Round. The upload deadline for PGNS's CAPA Spring Round (**Open Colour, Photojournalism, Digital Theme-Curves and Lines, Atlantic Zone and Canada: My Country**) is January 5, 2025.

Please remember that CAPA **will not accept** images which have any decorative elements like **frames, borders, pin-lines, or mats** in your image. This includes the edges and markings of scanned film. Also, please ensure you work on a copy of your image. The CAPA Director of Competition will request a copy of the original untouched JPG or RAW file with the EXIF metadata intact to verify and ensure that the editing criteria have been followed.

Black and white, infra-red or Monochrome images will not be accepted in the **Open Colour** competition. Sky replacement is allowed if you have taken the sky. Also, triptychs are allowed in this competition. Your image must fit one of the five following themes: **Still Life; Dramatic Contrast & Shadows; Action & Motion; Nature's Beauty or Travel**

In the Photojournalism competition, CAPA is looking for a "newsworthy" image which fits in one of the following themes: **Contemporary Issue; Environmental Issue; Animal/Botany/Bird/Insect** (as defined on the CAPA website, ie: not a "bird on a stick") or **Sports**. Black and White images are allowed. This category has **restricted editing** (only basic editing (colour enhancement, minor elements removed, no elements added, no infra-red or panoramas).

The Digital Theme assignment for CAPA this year is Curves and Lines. Your images must be from one of the following themes: **Geometry in Nature, Landscape, Minimal Still Life, Motion and Flow or Kaleidoscope Curves.**

For the Atlantic Zone competition, all submitted images must come from photographers who are **permanently residing in the Atlantic Zone**, and all submitted images must have been captured in the Atlantic Zone. The theme is open theme and a variety of subjects such as animals, birds, insects, landscape, nature, people, domesticated animals and wildlife or altered reality images can be submitted.

This year, for **Canada: My Country, CAPA** is looking for images that showcase the varied landscapes that shape our national identity and submitted images should bring our regional flavours and local pride to life. As well, images which tell a story of the people who call this land home such as photos of immigrant families starting new lives, school children growing together, workers driving local economies, and senior citizens passing down traditions are welcome.






