This year we held three Guild/PSA competitions.

6 images from each of the 5 categories were selected and sent to PSA Interclub Competitions, via the upload system on the PSA website.

After each of the 3 competitions, November, February and April, I make collages of the 6 images that will go away to represent us and those are placed here in the newsletter. (Thank you, Kathy!)

These are the club standings of PGNS after all is tallied for the season.

- Nature Group A --- Tied 14th in our group of 25 clubs *89 clubs overall
- PID Open Colour--- 12th in our group of 23 *143 clubs overall
- PID Open Mono--- 7th in our group of 25 *110 clubs overall
- Photojournalism ---6th in our group of 22 *40 clubs overall
- Photo Travel ---8th in our group of 25 *57 clubs overall

We received 17/90 Awards over the 5 categories – Merit and HMs

I prepared a PowerPoint presentation to highlight our standing and announce the awards for the AGM. A Googlegroup email was sent to the membership with details of our season successes. (May 13th) And then I sent the individual certificates to the 'winners'.
