Our last season was another successful Guild year with many some interesting presentations and field trips. Thanks to all of you who helped making it possible. Without your help, the Guild would not be able to operate. Thanks to Joyce, Viki, Darryl, Dean, Pam, Antonio, Kathy, Rosemary, Cheryl, Terry Boswell, Terry Carroll, and Pat. And thanks to all of you who competed with your images through the competition season.

I am hoping that this coming season will be even better than the last one. Our program team was working hard during the summer to have yet another season with many webinars and field trips. Naturally, the usual competitions are scheduled as well. The program is posted on our website - https://www.photoguild.ns.ca/schedule/. You can download the schedule to your calendar, or you can print it out.

There is a change in the competition schedule. To lighten the workload for the Guild/PSA competition judges, we moved the three creative competitions and the two Guild Assignments to a new competition night – March 1st. All three creative images will need to be new images and as usual, the Assignment images will need to be new as well.

There is a new category introduced this year – the Guild AI competition category. The images submitted to this category will be scored but will not be counted towards the Photographer of the Year trophy and no awards will be presented to the top scoring images either. This is the only category where the generative AI tools can be used. We will have a mini seminar on this coming Sunday (September 7), when we will go through the AI related tools.

We do have several field trips scheduled for this season, but if you'd like to lead one to an area you know, please contact Dean or any of the Executive team – we'd like to hear from you. Three field trips were scheduled for September, and more to come.

Most of our meetings are still held online, as per our Executive team's decision earlier this year, but we will have a few mixed meetings planned for this season.

Assignment #2: Monochrome (not true B&W) - Must be shot after September 1, 2025

One big change is CAPA's evolving AI policy to keep pace with the rapidly developing changes in photography editing software. **Starting on January 1, 2026**, CAPA will be implementing a new AI authentication standard. Sheldon Boles, CAPA's Director of Competitions has created documents outlining the new AI Authentication Standard as well as helpful guidelines for your favourite Photo-editing software to clarify which tools are accepted in CAPA competitions. All these documents are available for you to read in the members only section of the PGNS website.

As a reminder, for all CAPA competitions you must preserve the original metadata of your images.

Looking forward to seeing everyone's images at the CAPA evaluation on Sunday!




So, your assignment is to watch for the email regarding the upcoming PSA competition. Get your images ready and upload before the 19th. Can't wait to see your entries!!!

- Insect / tick repellent






